Now do-re-mi-fa-so and so on are the tools we use to build a song. Once you have these notes in your heads, you can sing a million different tunes by mixing them up -- Like this.

So Do La Fa Mi Do Re; So Do La Fa Mi Do Re

So Do La Ti Do Re Do; So Do La Ti Do Re Do

Now, Put it all together and put in words -- One word for every note. Like this.
